

CR-CMM Advisory Board Meeting Summary - March 2026

The CR-CMM Advisory Board met on 25 March 2026 to review current adoption, tool development priorities, mapping activities, and supporting resources. See below the summary of the discussion points and agreed actions.

Members are encouraged to use the presentation deck, add relevant use cases, and present at conferences and industry events.	Adoption and Outreach	Continue using the shared deck in external engagements and enrich it with practical examples where relevant.
All Advisory Board Members	Review of the materials shared for publication.	Governance and Communications	Confirm any material concerns within 10 days. If no material objections are raised, the materials will be treated as approved for publication.
All Advisory Board Members	Need for a central repository for current CR-CMM material.	Supporting Materials	Upload relevant files to OneDrive and circulate a shared link.
All Advisory Board Members	Need for a short description of each Advisory Board practice area.	Supporting Materials	Prepare a one-page description of each practice area and its relevance to CR-CMM.
Vicky, Carlos Recalde, Francesco Chiarini, Lorenzo	Opportunity to create a lighter version of the tool for executives.	Tool	Explore a lighter C-level version, potentially through the profile tab, focused on a short quick-assessment format.

Surendra and Carlos Recalde	FAQ and practical guidance should be expanded to explain how the tool is used and how organizations can leverage CR-CMM.	Resources	Expand the FAQ to cover assessment approach, key stakeholders to interview, how to structure sessions, and how organizations can use CR-CMM to shape programmes and operating models.

Centralize working material in a shared OneDrive repository and streamline review and approval of publication-ready content.

Develop lighter executive-facing assessment options and strengthen tool disclaimers and usage guidance.

Continue the mapping initiative across CR-CMM practices, including ISO 27031, CRI, and cyber risk quantification approaches such as FAIR.

Expand supporting resources, including FAQs, stakeholder interview guidance, and practice-area descriptions from Advisory Board members.
